BARGAINING UPDATE

There have been no negotiations in the last few weeks as the team felt it would be better to spend the time getting a better understanding of how the district got the numbers they are using. We are still trying to get on the same

page with our understanding of the numbers. Jake Anderson, our CTA staff person, and Courtney Stockton, Bargaining Chair, spent over an hour with District number crunchers, Jon Sand, Susan Tucker and Mark McLaughlin, trying to do just that. They left the District folks with some questions that they were checking and we are still awaiting their response.

Your bargaining team is looking at multiple metrics to decide what makes a fair settlement. The three main things we look at are:

- 1. Other associations' negotiations results
- 2. How we compare to others' salary schedules
- 3. The funding behind the raises.
- 1. Other associations' negotiation results

The range of settlements that are coming in this year are between 3% and 10%, but most are in the 5%ish range. The places that have been getting the high settlements are playing catch-up because many have not had significant raises (or any) for the last few years. Also, some chapters have opted for higher salaries instead of increases of district contributions to health plans resulting in higher employee contributions for health benefits.

3. The Funding behind the raises.

Our funding is very different from our neighbors. As you recall, the Governor and legislature changed the funding model so that schools with high populations of EL students, students on free and reduced lunch, and foster children get a larger share of the education funding. We do not have large populations of these students so our funding is significantly less than our neighbors. We also do not have parcel taxes helping the funding (like Oak Park and Las Virgenes). This is a factor in how we compare currently and how we will in the future.

The next bargaining session is scheduled for 12/15. Thank you for being patience while we continue to decipher the district's finances and work to achieve a strong settlement. We are getting closer.

Other schools may qualify. Attend the event to find out for certain.
