FUNDING ALERT: PROP 30 TO EXPIRE

The voters of CA passed Prop 30 in 2012 to prevent an additional \$6,000,000,000 in cuts to CA schools. This would have been on top of \$56,000,000,000 in devastating cuts that had already occurred, resulting in lay offs, increased class size, furlough days, pay cuts, and more. If we had not passed Prop 30, CVUSD was set to cut an additional 18 days from the school year, lay offs of 80 teachers, 100 full-time equivalent custodians, secretaries, health & library clerks, counselors and administrative positions, and site budgets slashed. The passage of Prop 30 stopped these cuts.

Passing Prop 30 eased the devastating cuts during the economic downturn and allowed us 9.8% in raises over the past 3 years. Our district is no longer deficit spending and programs such as the Breakthrough program have been funded. However, the quarter –cent sales tax is set to expire the end of 2016 and the 1% tax on individuals who make \$250,000 a year or couples who make \$500,000 a year will sunset in 2018.

Prop 30 was meant as a temporary measure to give the Legislature time to come up with a permanent funding solution for education. Even with Prop 30, we were still ranked 46th in education spending. Apparently we were too optimistic that this could be done in six years. Nothing has been done yet to find this solution.

The Children's Education and Health Care Protection Act has been proposed. This extends Prop 30 for 12 years. This is not a new tax or a tax on top of the previous tax. It simply extends the current income tax for 12 more years. The sales tax will still expire at the end of this year.

Without Prop 30 extension, we are set to loose nearly \$5,000,000,000 in the first year without Prop 30. This would mean about \$3,000,000 for our district. The measure is expected to raise \$8-11 billion a year that will go directly into a special fund that supports k-12 education and community colleges. This measure includes strict accountability provisions and will not permit any of the funds to go towards bureaucracy or administrative costs and is subject to audits by the State Controller.


The Expiration of Proposition 30's Tax Increases Would Leave a Permanent Gap in State Revenues

Among the most-watched ballot measures in the mix for California's 2016 election cycle is one that would extend Proposition 30's personal income tax (PIT) rate increases on high-income earners, which were approved by voters in 2012. These rate increases expire at the end of calendar year 2018, halfway through the state's 2018-19 fiscal year.

The expiration of Prop. 30's PIT rate increases would leave a permanent gap in state General Fund revenues – an estimated \$4.4 billion in 2018-19 and \$7.7 billion in 2019-20, with annual revenue losses continuing indefinitely. To put these amounts in perspective, Governor Brown's proposed budget for 2016-17 includes a total of \$8.0 billion in General Fund support for the California State University, University of California, and Student Aid Commission combined.¹

¹ This projection of the lost Proposition 30 PIT revenues in 2019-20 is dependent in part on the projection of that revenue stream in the preceding fiscal years. The latest publicly available estimate is from the Legislative Analyst's Office's (LAO) November 2015 Fiscal Outlook. http://www.lao.ca.gov/LAOEconTax/Article/Detail/147
The Administration's more recent Prop. 30 revenues projection (not yet public) could differ from the LAO's, which would affect the projected lost revenues in 2019-20. For comparison, the LAO's analysis of the fiscal effects of the ballot initiative to extend the Prop. 30 PIT rates concludes that around \$7.5 billion is "one reasonable expectation of the additional revenue that this measure would generate in 2019." http://www.lao.ca.gov/BallotAnalysis/Initiative/2015-115

- 5. April 5 8 Online voting system prepared.
- 6. April 11-22 Online voting opens. Those who have not given UACT a home email may vote in the UACT office at 100 E Thousand Oaks Blvd. Suite 124, Thousand Oaks, CA. Voting hours are 11:30 to 3:45 Monday, Tuesday and Friday. 10:30 to 2:45 on Thursday.

- 9. April 29— Deadline for challenges for UACT Executive Board Election and CTA State Council Elections
